From the Pastor

We have been traveling a difficult road together. Now, that journey is over.

It didn't end because you voted but because the Judicial Council made a decision of church law which ended the South Carolina Conference's use of paragraph 2549 of the *Book of Discipline* to allow local churches to leave the denomination.

The pages after this one will include a letter that your Church Council has mailed to Bishop Fairley and a letter to you. I hope that you will take the time to read and consider them.

The announcement of the end of the closure and separation process has pressed me to rewrite my November article. As I wondered what words of comfort I would offer now, I was reminded of the final words of the Rev. John Wesley. As I am sure many of you know, he and a few other men were the beginning of the Methodist movement — which some credit as keeping England



from plunging into a civil war. Wesley died on March 2, 1791. His last words are said to have been, "Best of all is, God is with us!"

As you all ponder what is next, I pray that you will keep those words in mind. God is with us.

My prayer is that, having gone through the discernment process together, and having had discussions with each other, you will remain together as one church now that the opportunity to separate has passed.

In the third chapter of Colossians, Paul writes these words to us:

¹² Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, ¹³ bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. ¹⁴ And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. ¹⁵ And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful.

This is a confusing time, frustration will surely be felt by many. This is also a time for bearing with one another, forgiving one another, and putting on love as if it is a protective garment that can preserve our unity. This is all extremely necessary if you wish to emerge from this time still one with each other, and in love with each other. The best hope we can have is for the peace of Christ to continue to rule in our hearts and for us to continue to be in holy relationship with one another through Christ. More than anything else, that is what I am hoping for you. Do not let this break up your church family.

At the top right of this page is an image I bought for use on a website (from istock.com) some time ago. It The image depicts a group of people gathered so that they form the shape of a cross. If you and I continue to gather around the cross of Christ and allow our life together to be shaped by Jesus' death and resurrection for us, Paul's words of comfort are possible— we will be bound together by what Christ has done for us and by the love of God demonstrated for us in Christ's death (Romans 5:8). It is in this act of gathering around the cross that the distractions and disappointments we have experienced will cease to direct our hearts. As we gather around the cross it is possible for us to continue to be able to live together as one body even though we may disagree about whether the Church should allow same-gender weddings or ordain practicing gay Clergy. Our unity is in Christ Jesus.

So, I echo Paul's words, "let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful."

My prayers for you continue.

Dear Bishop Fairley,

Greetings in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

We write to inform you that due to Judicial Council decision 1512 and the ending of the Closure and Separation process, the Church Council of Manning United Methodist Church has determined that Manning UMC will no longer make apportionment payments.

Our Church Council held on faithfully, deciding to await a decision by the General Conference instead of rushing to enter the Closure and Separation process when it was announced in December of 2022. In 2023, we made the same decision to be faithful and wait. We acknowledge that the Conference Board of Trustees informed us that this decision was possible. Still, we are disappointed that there is now no possible way to preserve our congregation by exiting The UMC. We now anticipate that we will suffer significant loss in worship attendance, membership, and financial support.

As such, we will no longer send apportionment payments.

Re: Closure and Separation Process Ending

October 29, 2024

Dear members and constituents of MUMC,

As was announced August 1st (via email and newsletter), in the "Closure and Separation 2025" document (emailed and published to the website on August 7th), the initial Town Hall meeting on August 8th, and reiterated at the following discussion groups, there was potential for a Judicial Council (our supreme court) decision that could affect the discernment process and opportunity for churches to exit The United Methodist Church. At their Annual Conferences the Kentucky Conference and the West-Alabama Conference made requests to the Judicial Council for a ruling on the use of paragraph 2549 of the *Book of Discipline* to allow churches to exit the denomination and receive the properties.

In its decision #1512, the Judicial Council of The United Methodist Church has ruled on the Alabama-West Florida Conference request and has stated that paragraph 2549 of the *Book of Discipline* **may not be used** to allow churches to exit The United Methodist Church.

Today, Pastor David received via email a statement from our Bishop, Leonard Fairley, and the Chair of Trustees for the Conference, Rev. Shannon Bullion, stating the following:

As a connectional church, the South Carolina Conference is bound by the decisions of the Judicial Council.

The impact of this decision is that, effective immediately, the Local Church Closure and Separation Process approved by the Trustees of the Annual Conference is no longer available as a means of separation from the denomination.

This means that, though you have completed the discernment process, a church conference vote will not be taken on whether or not MUMC should leave The United Methodist Church. This decision of the Judicial Council effectively eliminates the only current option for MUMC to leave The United Methodist Church.

Both the Judicial Council decision and the statement from Bishop Fairley and the Chair of Conference Trustees have been posted to our website under the "Discernment Process" menu tab.

You may recall that Pastor David has clarified for us on several occasions that paragraph 2549 was the only paragraph of the *Book of Discipline* that was being used in South Carolina to allow churches to leave. Our Resident Bishop at the time, Johnathan Holston, had ruled that churches that agreed with the 2019 *Book of Discipline* (which did not allow either same-sex marriages or self-avowed practicing

homosexuals to be ordained) could not use paragraph 2553 to disaffiliate from the church. Instead, the Bishop and Trustees provided a process using paragraph 2549. This process was announced on December 17, 2022. Some of you may ask why we did not enter the discernment process in 2022 or 2023, we call your attention to the reasons outlined in the August edition of the Manning Monthly Newsletter or the document entitled "Discernment Process Info 8/1/2024" under the "Discernment Process" tab on our website.

Pastor David called a Church Council meeting for Tuesday, October 29 at 6:30 PM for the purpose of announcing the Judicial Council decision and the effects of the decision to the Church Council. Your Church Council has decided to take the following steps in light of the decision of the Judicial Council and that of Bishop Fairley and Trustees of the SC Conference.

- 1. The church council approved a motion to cease all payments of apportionments to the SC Conference of The United Methodist Church.
- 2. A letter was drafted to Bishop Fairley announcing the church council's decision. That letter is attached.
- 3. This letter was authorized for immediate release to detail the church council's actions and to announce the end of the closure and separation process.

We know that many of you will be greatly upset by this development. There are some things that we wish to remind you of. The General Conference has not forced MUMC to allow same-sex weddings or for its pastor to officiate at them. The Board of Trustees and the Church Council of MUMC had made changes to our *A Policy on the Service of Christian Marriage* to include the following provision:

"Only couples comprised of one biological female and one biological male may be married on the grounds of Manning United Methodist Church."

It will continue to be the case that the appointment of pastors to MUMC will be made in consultation with the Staff-Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) and that their wishes will be factored into consideration regarding the appointing of LGBTQIA+ clergy.

We hope that you will consider the ministry that is happening here, your relationships with other parishioners, and the fact that God has not decided to abandon MUMC. We still experience the presence of Christ through the Holy Spirit in our worship and service together. Let us not lose sight of that. We pray that you will continue to be part of the life of this congregation that has served this community for so many generations.

The Church Council intends that MUMC will continue to be welcoming to all people.


